1. Mennonite Church Canada Assembly (June 28-July 2, Calgary)

Proposed Discernment Model:

At last year's assembly the General Secretary, Jack Suderman, presented a [paper](#) discussing how ongoing discernment on various issues is a necessary part of being a faithful church. The paper proposed a model for discernment, and identified five themes that "require ongoing attention," including "human sexuality in the life of the church." This year the delegate body will be practicing this discernment model on the issue of being a peace church ([2010 paper](#)). Some smaller groups will be practicing discernment on other issues, including sexuality.

Practicing a discernment model is not actually discerning, nor is it making a decision or taking action. Nonetheless, a discernment model that is fair, allows for a plurality of voices and is particularly sensitive to those most impacted is usually good news for the LGBTQ and allied community. We are interested in your insights, and invite you to evaluate the discernment model and share your comments with BMC and your area church / denominational leaders.

Several individuals from MC Canada congregations have submitted a notice of a motion that will be presented at next year's Assembly. The motion calls for the revocation of the [1986 and 1987 resolutions](#) on sexuality. 6. Marriage Equality Conference in Iowa

Midwesterners are invited to the campus of Luther College in Decorah, Iowa on August 13-14 to explore ways to expand marriage equality to neighboring states, maintain it in Iowa, and build alliances and support for work throughout the heartland. The conference will bring together Midwestern PFLAG (Parents and Friends of Lesbians and Gays), allies, faith-based groups, legislative leaders and policy makers for a lively time of conversation, workshops and keynotes. 7. Lesbian Mothers Study

According to a 20+ year study recently published in the Journal of Pediatrics

(<http://pediatrics.aappublications.org/cgi/reprint/peds.2009-3153v1>), adolescent sons and daughters raised in planned lesbian families are doing just fine. In fact, the 17-year-olds "were rated significantly higher in social, school/academic, and total competence and significantly lower in social problems, rule-breaking, aggressive, and externalizing problem behavior than their age-matched counterparts." This is one more reason to believe that what children need most is to be loved and wanted by adults of any gender.

8. Congratulations to Johanna Sigurdardottir

Iceland's Prime Minister married her partner, Jonina Leosdottir, on June 27, the same day that Iceland became the 9th country to legalize same-sex marriage. Sigurdardottir is the first openly gay head of state in modern times. Can you name the other eight countries with marriage equality?

9. Happy Belated Pride Month!



Pride is a time to celebrate the LGBTQ community and affirm our lives as good. Pride is most often celebrated at the end of June in memory of the 1969 Stonewall Rebellion, usually heralded as the beginning of the modern LGBTQ liberation movement. Communities often celebrate with parades, fireworks, picnics, parties, film festivals and other gatherings. It's a good time to show your pride by making a commitment to ensuring that your church or community is a safe and just place for LGBTQ people and our families.
