The Religious Institute has created a database featuring up-to-date information about the official positions of major US religious denominations on sexuality-related issues. The database includes statements from 28 denominations covering official positions on more than 20 issues, including marriage, gender identity, abortion, sexuality education and sexual abuse. Each entry consists of the full text (or excerpt) of a denomination's position on a particular issue, as well as a link to the original source.
